

Ralf Baron, Director of Pain Research and Therapy, **Schleswig-Holstein**

Professor Dr. med. Ralf Baron is Head of the Division of Neurological Pain Research and Therapy and Vice Chair of the Department of Neurology, Christian-Albrechts-Universität Kiel, in Germany. He received his medical degree from Christian-Albrechts-Universität Kiel, and completed postgraduate medical training in experimental neurophysiology and neuroanatomy (Prof. W. Jänig, University of Kiel). From 1999-2004, he served as General Secretary of the German Interdisciplinary Pain Society (DIVS), from 2005-2010 he served as a Management Committee Member of the Neuropathic Pain Special Interest Group (NeuPSIG) of the International Association for the Study of Pain (IASP) and from 2008-2010 as a board member of the Deutsche Gesellschaft zum Studium des Schmerzes. His main research interest is the pathophysiology and therapy of neuropathic pain states. He has intensive scientific collaborations with several researchers worldwide, e.g., Prof. E.M. McLachlan, Sydney, Australia, Prof. H.L. Fields, San Francisco, USA, and Prof. T.S. Jensen, Aarhus, Denmark. Professor Baron is associated editor and reviewer for many scientific journals (Advisory Board Member for Nature Reviews Neurology, Associate Editor for Pain and the European Journal of Pain). He is also a member of several professional societies, including Deutsche Gesellschaft für Neurologie, Deutsche Gesellschaft zum Studium des Schmerzes and the International Association for the Study of Pain, and has been the recipient of awards such as the annual award given by the German Pain Society and the German Neurological Society. In 1998 he was awarded a Feodor Lynen fellowship by the German Humboldt Foundation to spend his sabbatical at the Department of Neurology, University of California, San Francisco.
